The Centre for Innovation in Teaching and Learning (CITL) is now accepting proposal submissions to present at Memorial University's 2022 Teaching and Learning Conference, which will be held virtually on May 4-5.

The theme for this year's conference is **Teaching for Change**. Through this theme the university community is invited to share their practices and experiences with helping learners build a sense of belonging in their course, program, university, community and the world.

Proposals can range from leading a discussions on a teaching practice, to workshops to demonstrate a successful teaching practice or skill, to a short pitch of a new teaching idea, to formal presentations on practices tested for their impact on student learning.
